AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1101
(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, at the top of the page, insert “EMERGENCY BILL”; in the sponsor line, strike “**Senator Smith**” and substitute “**Senators Smith, Bailey, James, West, McKay, and Folden**”; strike line 2 in its entirety and substitute “**Higher Education – Maryland Police Officers and Probation Agents Scholarship Program – Alterations**”; strike beginning with “requiring” in line 3 down through “II” in line 9 and substitute “altering the definition of an eligible institution for the Maryland Police Officers and Probation Agents Scholarship Program to include a community college in the State”; strike beginning with “police” in line 9 down through “scholarships” in line 10 and substitute “the Maryland Police Officers and Probation Agents Scholarship Program”; and strike in their entirety lines 11 through 25, inclusive.

On page 2, in line 1, strike “18–101(a), (b), and (c)” and substitute “18–3801(a) and 18–3802(a) and (b)”; in line 6, strike “18–103” and substitute “18–3801(b)”; and strike in their entirety lines 9 through 20, inclusive.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 2 and 3, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 23 on page 2 through line 26 on page 3, inclusive.

On pages 3 through 11, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 28 on page 3 through line 17 on page 11, inclusive, and substitute:

“18–3801.

- (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) “Eligible institution” means [a]:

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(1) A public senior higher education institution in the State; OR

(2) A COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN THE STATE.

18-3802.

(a) There is a Maryland Police Officers and Probation Agents Scholarship Program.

(b) The purpose of the program is to provide tuition assistance for students who are:

(1) Attending an eligible institution and enrolled in a degree program that would further the student's intent to become a police officer or probation agent after graduation; or

(2) Employed as a police officer or probation agent, attending an eligible institution, and enrolled in a degree program that would further the police officer's or probation officer's career.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted."
