AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "Maryland Pediatric Cancer Fund -Modifications" and substitute "<u>Public Health – Maryland Pediatric Cancer Fund</u> <u>and Commission</u>"; in line 5, after "treatment;" insert "<u>establishing the Pediatric</u> <u>Cancer Research Commission to oversee the award of competitive grants from the</u> <u>Fund;</u>"; in line 6, after "Fund" insert "<u>and the Pediatric Cancer Research Commission</u>"; and after line 11, insert:

"<u>BY adding to</u>

<u>Article - Health - General</u> <u>Section 20–121</u> <u>Annotated Code of Maryland</u> (2023 Replacement Volume)".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, in line 25, after "account" insert "<u>TO BE ALLOCATED TO A STATE–</u> <u>BASED CHILDHOOD CANCER ORGANIZATION</u>"; and in the same line, after "Fund" insert "<u>AND TO EDUCATE THE STATE SCIENTIFIC COMMUNITY ABOUT THE</u> <u>OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDHOOD CANCER RESEARCH THROUGH THE FUND</u>".

On page 3, after line 9, insert:

"<u>20-121.</u>

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "COMMISSION" MEANS THE PEDIATRIC CANCER RESEARCH COMMISSION.

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(B) THERE IS A PEDIATRIC CANCER RESEARCH COMMISSION.

(C) THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION IS TO OVERSEE THE AWARD OF COMPETITIVE GRANTS FROM THE PEDIATRIC CANCER FUND, ESTABLISHED UNDER § 20–120 OF THIS SUBTITLE, TO PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ENTITIES IN THE STATE.

(D) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF:

(1) <u>The Secretary of Health, or the Secretary's</u> <u>Designee; and</u>

(2) <u>THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:</u>

(I) <u>Two individuals who are adult survivors of</u> <u>PEDIATRIC CANCER OR CAREGIVERS OF PEDIATRIC CANCER PATIENTS, FROM A</u> <u>LIST SUBMITTED BY THE AMERICAN CHILDHOOD CANCER ORGANIZATION;</u>

(II) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE AMERICAN CHILDHOOD CANCER ORGANIZATION;

(III) <u>Two scientists with expertise in pediatric</u> <u>cancer research from the University of Maryland;</u>

(IV) <u>Two scientists with expertise in pediatric</u> <u>cancer research from Johns Hopkins University;</u>

(V) <u>TWO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES WHO</u> HAVE EXPERIENCE IN PEDIATRIC CANCER CARE; SB0013/243323/01Finance CommitteeAmendments to SB 13Page 3 of 6

(VI) ONE PHYSICIAN WITH EXPERTISE IN TREATING PEDIATRIC CANCER PATIENTS FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND MEDICAL SYSTEM;

(VII) ONE PHYSICIAN WITH EXPERTISE IN TREATING PEDIATRIC CANCER PATIENTS FROM JOHNS HOPKINS MEDICINE;

(VIII) ONE PHYSICIAN WITH EXPERTISE IN PEDIATRIC ONCOLOGY FROM LIFEBRIDGE HEALTH; AND

(IX) ONE INDIVIDUAL WITH EXPERTISE IN PEDIATRIC ONCOLOGY FROM THE NATIONAL CANCER INSTITUTE.

(E) (1) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.

(2) THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON OCTOBER 1, 2024.

(3) IF A VACANCY OCCURS DURING THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A SUCCESSOR WHO SHALL SERVE UNTIL THE TERM EXPIRES.

(4) <u>AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER MAY CONTINUE TO SERVE</u> ONLY UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

(Over)

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(5) <u>A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN</u> SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS <u>APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.</u>

(6) <u>A MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE</u> <u>FULL TERMS.</u>

(F) EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION SHALL DISCLOSE TO THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION WHETHER THE MEMBER IS EMPLOYED BY OR HAS A FINANCIAL INTEREST IN AN ENTITY THAT MAY APPLY TO CONDUCT STATE– FUNDED PEDIATRIC CANCER RESEARCH.

(G) (1) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR NEGLECT OF DUTY, INCOMPETENCE, MISCONDUCT, MALFEASANCE, MISFEASANCE, NONFEASANCE, OR ANY OTHER SUFFICIENT CAUSE.

(2) <u>The Governor may not remove a member for political</u> <u>Party preference.</u>

(H) (1) <u>A MAJORITY OF THE FULL AUTHORIZED MEMBERSHIP OF THE</u> <u>COMMISSION IS A QUORUM.</u>

(2) <u>THE DECISION OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE BY A MAJORITY</u> OF THE QUORUM PRESENT AND VOTING.

(I) <u>THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR, AT THE</u> <u>TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.</u>

(J) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

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(1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION; BUT

(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(K) THE COMMISSION ANNUALLY SHALL ELECT A CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS.

(L) <u>THE COMMISSION SHALL:</u>

(1) DEVELOP CRITERIA, STANDARDS, AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS FOR PEDIATRIC CANCER RESEARCH GRANTS FROM THE PEDIATRIC CANCER FUND;

(2) ESTABLISH PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES TO BE USED IN THE REVIEW, EVALUATION, RANKING, AND RATING OF THE RESEARCH GRANT PROPOSALS;

(3) <u>Review grant applications to ensure that each</u> <u>Application is complete and satisfies the criteria, standards, and</u> <u>Requirements developed by the Commission under item (1) of this</u> <u>subsection;</u>

(4) DEVELOP DISCLOSURE AND RECUSAL GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION WHEN CONSIDERING GRANT APPLICATIONS;

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(5) ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR THE OVERSIGHT OF AWARDS; AND

(6) CONDUCT PROGRESS REVIEWS OF GRANT RECIPIENTS.

(M) THE COMMISSION MAY CONSULT WITH EXPERTS IN PERFORMING ITS DUTIES.

<u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial</u> <u>members of the Pediatric Cancer Research Commission shall expire as follows:</u>

- (1) four members in 2025;
- (2) four members in 2026; and
- (3) five members in 2027.";

and in line 10, strike "2." and substitute "<u>3.</u>".
