AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1099
(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in the sponsor line, strike “**and West**” and substitute “**, West, Augustine, Brooks, Feldman, Hester, Kagan, Lewis Young, and Simonaire**”; and in line 11, after “overdose,” insert “requiring that the initiative be funded using available funds from the Opioid Restitution Fund.”.

On page 2, after line 1, insert:

“BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,
Article - State Finance and Procurement
Section 7-331(a)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
Article - State Finance and Procurement
Section 7-331(f)(1)(i)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)”.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 8, in line 20, after “**FOR**” insert “**COMMUNITY USE FOR**”.

On page 9, strike beginning with “**IN**” in line 11 down through “**PROGRAM**” in line 12 and substitute “**USING AVAILABLE FUNDS FROM THE OPIOID RESTITUTION FUND**”; and after line 28, insert:

“Article – State Finance and Procurement

(a) In this section, “Fund” means the Opioid Restitution Fund.

(f) The Fund may be used only to provide funds for:

(1) programs, services, supports, and resources for evidence-based substance use disorder prevention, treatment, recovery, or harm reduction that have the purpose of:

(i) improving access to medications proven to prevent or reverse an overdose, INCLUDING BY SUPPORTING THE INITIATIVE TO CO-LOCATE NALOXONE WITH AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS PLACED IN PUBLIC BUILDINGS UNDER § 13-518 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE;”.
