BY adding to Article – Land Use Section 10–104 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Land Use Section 10–202 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
