# 2 Property Tax – Credit for Dwelling House of Disabled Veterans – Alterations

FOR the purpose of altering eligibility for a certain property tax credit against the county
or municipal corporation property tax on the dwelling house of certain disabled
veterans to include individuals who have been declared by the U.S. Department of
Veterans Affairs to have a certain nonpermanent, service-connected disability
rating; altering the criteria for determining the amount of the credit; and generally
relating to a property tax credit for the dwelling house of a disabled veteran.
