- 1 (2) The Teacher Development and Retention Program is a pilot program 2 designed to incentivize a cohort of students to pursue a career in the teaching profession.
- 3 (b) (1) The purpose of the Program is to provide support to eligible individuals 4 who ultimately pledge to fulfill a service obligation as a teacher employed full—time in a 5 high—needs school, grade level, or content area in the State in which there is a shortage of 6 teachers, as identified by the Department.
- 7 (2) The Program shall provide financial support to eligible individuals 8 interested in pursuing a career in the teaching profession, beginning by offering eligible 9 individuals a one—time stipend for participation in an experiential learning opportunity in a classroom and concluding by placing those individuals in high—needs schools, grade levels, or content areas.
- 12 (c) The Office shall establish eligibility criteria for the Program, including 13 requirements for an applicant to:
- 14 (1) Be enrolled in the first or second year at an institution of initial 15 eligibility in an associate's or a bachelor's degree program; and
- 16 (2) Before receiving an educator internship stipend under § 18–2703 of this subtitle, pledge to fulfill a service obligation as a teacher employed full–time in a high–needs school, grade level, or content area in which there is a shortage of teachers, as identified by the Department, for a minimum of 2 years.

- 21 (a) (1) In each school year from the [2023–2024] **2024–2025** school year through the [2025–2026] **2026–2027** school year, a recipient who is selected for support under the Program shall receive an initial stipend to support the recipient's participation in an experiential learning opportunity in a public school or publicly funded prekindergarten classroom.
- 26 (2) The experiential learning opportunity shall:
- 27 (i) Occur within the first or second year of the recipient's enrollment 28 in an institution of initial eligibility; and
- 29 <u>(ii)</u> Contribute to the education of the students in the classroom in 30 which the recipient participates.
- 31 (3) The purpose of the initial stipend awarded under this subsection is to nurture in the recipient a passion for becoming a teacher.
- 33 (4) If the institution of initial eligibility has a written agreement with a public partner school or publicly funded prekindergarten program for the establishment of

- 11 (ii) <u>Is currently engaged in an internship or a practicum providing</u>

- 14 <u>(iii)</u> Continues to make satisfactory progress toward a degree and 15 maintain the standards of the institution; and
