Lewis Requested: October 17, 2023 Introduced and read first time: January 10, 2024 Assigned to: Health and Government Operations A BILL ENTITLED AN ACT concerning Hospitals – Care of Infants After Discharge FOR the purpose of requiring a hospital to take certain actions relating to the care of infants before the hospital discharges an infant, including providing written instructions to the parent or legal guardian on how to provide a safe sleep environment and providing, under certain circumstances, a list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal guardian; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to develop a list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal guardian; and generally relating to the care of infants after discharge from a hospital. BY adding to Article - Health - General Section 19-308.10 Annotated Code of Maryland (2023 Replacement Volume) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 19-308.10. IN THIS SECTION, "SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT" MEANS, AS DESCRIBED (A) IN AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS POLICY STATEMENTS, AN ENVIRONMENT IN WHICH A NEWBORN MAY SLEEP THAT REDUCES THE RISK OF ALL SLEEP-RELATED INFANT DEATHS. **(B) (1)** BEFORE A HOSPITAL DISCHARGES AN INFANT INTO THE CARE OF

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- 1 A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN, THE HOSPITAL SHALL PROVIDE ORAL AND WRITTEN
- 2 INSTRUCTIONS TO THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN ON HOW TO:
- 3 (I) PROVIDE A SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT;
- 4 (II) AVOID SHAKEN BABY SYNDROME, AS DESCRIBED IN
- 5 AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS POLICY STATEMENTS; AND
- 6 (III) COPE WITH CRYING INFANTS AND THE STRESS, 7 FRUSTRATION, AND FATIGUE CREATED BY CARING FOR INFANTS.
- 8 (2) THE INSTRUCTIONS REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 9 SUBSECTION MAY BE SUPPLEMENTED BY AN INSTRUCTIONAL VIDEO.
- 10 (C) (1) BEFORE DISCHARGING AN INFANT, A HOSPITAL SHALL:
- 11 (I) INQUIRE AS TO WHETHER THE INFANT'S PARENT OR LEGAL
- 12 GUARDIAN IS ABLE TO PROVIDE THE INFANT WITH:
- 13 1. A SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT; AND
- 14 2. A BASSINET, CRIB, OR PORTABLE CRIB;
- 15 (II) INFORM THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OF THE
- 16 IMPORTANCE OF ENSURING THAT THE INFANT HAS A SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT
- 17 AND THE RISKS OF SUFFOCATION AND SUDDEN INFANT DEATH IN UNSAFE SLEEP
- 18 ENVIRONMENTS; AND
- 19 (III) PROVIDE EACH PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN WITH A
- 20 STANDARDIZED FORM, IN CLEAR AND SIMPLE LANGUAGE, TO BE SIGNED BY THE
- 21 PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN, THAT CONFIRMS THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN
- 22 UNDERSTANDS THE INSTRUCTIONS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
- 23 SECTION AND THE INFORMATION DESCRIBED UNDER ITEM (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.
- 24 (2) If the infant's parent or legal guardian cannot provide
- 25 A SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT, OR A BASSINET, CRIB, OR PORTABLE CRIB, THE
- 26 HOSPITAL SHALL PROVIDE A LIST OF RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR THE PARENT OR
- 27 LEGAL GUARDIAN TO OBTAIN THE ITEMS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE A SAFE SLEEP
- 28 ENVIRONMENT FOR THE INFANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2025,
- 30 the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with local health officers, hospitals,
- 31 the Maryland Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, and other stakeholders,
- 32 shall develop for distribution to parents and legal guardians a list of resources available for

- 1 the applicable geographic area of each health care facility, as defined in § 20–1801 of the
- 2 Health General Article, to obtain the items necessary to provide a safe sleep environment
- 3 for an infant, as described under Section 1 of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2024.
