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## Hospitals – Care of Infants After Discharge (Safe Sleep Act of 2024)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a hospital to take certain actions relating to the care of infants as soon as practicable before the hospital discharges an infant after the birth of the  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 infant, including providing oral and written instructions educational resources to the 7 parent or legal guardian on how to provide a safe sleep environment and providing. 8 under certain circumstances, a list of resources available for an infant's parent or 9 legal guardian; requiring a hospital, on or before a certain date each year, to establish a process for providing certain educational resources and confirming 10 receipt of the resources; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to develop a 11 12list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal guardian; and generally relating to the care of infants after discharge from a hospital. 13
