A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Natural Resources – Maryland State Parks – Funds and Plan Alterations**

3 FOR the purpose of extending the date by which the Park System Critical Maintenance
4 Fund must be expended; authorizing the Park System Capital Improvements and
5 Acquisition Fund to be used for State projects on lands managed by the Department
6 of Natural Resources for public purposes; altering the allowable uses of funds for the
7 initial allocation to the Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund;
8 authorizing the Great Maryland Outdoors Fund to be used for promoting outdoor
9 environmental education in the State; extending the date by which the Department
10 is required to develop and publish a Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan; and
11 generally relating to the State park system.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 **Article – Natural Resources**

2 (a) In this section, “Fund” means the Park System Critical Maintenance Fund.

3 (b) There is a Park System Critical Maintenance Fund.

4 (c) The purpose of the Fund is to provide funding for completing State projects
5 that address critical maintenance concerns on lands managed by the Department for public
6 purposes.

7 (g) The Fund may be used only for State park projects that address critical
8 maintenance concerns on lands managed by the Department for public purposes.

9 (k) (1) For fiscal year 2024 only, the Governor shall include in the annual
10 budget bill a General Fund appropriation in the amount of \$70,000,000 to the Fund for
11 State projects that address critical maintenance concerns on lands managed by the
12 Department for public purposes.

13 (2) The Department shall expend the funds allocated under this subsection
14 before July 1, ~~[2026]~~ **2029**.

16 (a) In this section, “Fund” means the Park System Capital Improvements and
17 Acquisition Fund.

18 (b) There is a Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund.

19 (c) The purpose of the Fund is to provide funding for:

20 (1) Completing State **[park]** projects related to capital improvements on
21 lands managed by the Department for public purposes; and

22 (2) Acquiring land to be managed by the Department for public purposes
23 **[as a State park]**.

24 (g) The Fund may be used only for:

25 (1) Completing State **[park]** projects related to capital improvements on
26 lands managed by the Department for public purposes; and

27 (2) Acquiring land to be managed by the Department for public purposes
28 **[as a State park]**.

29 (j) Money expended from the Fund for capital improvements **[in the State’s**

1 parks] **FOR STATE PROJECTS ON LANDS MANAGED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR**
2 **PUBLIC PURPOSES** is supplemental to and is not intended to take the place of funding
3 that otherwise would be appropriated for capital improvements [in the State's parks] **FOR**
4 **STATE PROJECTS ON LANDS MANAGED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR PUBLIC**
5 **PURPOSES** and the acquisition of land by the Department that will be managed for public
6 purposes.

7 (l) The first \$70,000,000 received by the Fund may be used only as follows:

8 (1) **AT LEAST** \$5,000,000 for infrastructure projects that mitigate the
9 effects of climate change, including:

10 (i) Flood barriers;

11 (ii) Forest buffers;

12 (iii) Green spaces;

13 (iv) Building elevation;

14 (v) Stormwater infrastructure;

15 (vi) Wetlands restoration; and

16 (vii) Addressing environmental justice concerns;

17 (2) **AT LEAST** \$5,000,000 for historic preservation, in accordance with
18 subsection (m) of this section;

19 (3) **AT LEAST** \$20,000,000 for transportation improvements, including:

20 (i) Improving bike lanes and trails, increasing walkability, and
21 expanding parking availability; and

22 (ii) Targeting transportation investments to avoid capacity
23 shutdowns;

24 (4) **AT LEAST** \$10,000,000 for increasing water access, including kayak
25 and boat launches and areas for picnicking near water and swimming; and

26 (5) **UP TO** \$30,000,000 for land acquisition, including:

27 (i) Areas in the central and southern regions of the State that will:

28 1. Relieve overcrowding at existing State parks; and

1 (a) The Department shall:

2 (1) Develop and publish a Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan by
3 December 1, ~~[2023]~~ **2024**;

4 (2) Update the Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan every 5 years
5 to reflect major goals and progress toward meeting those goals; and

6 (3) Submit to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the
7 State Government Article, the Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan and any updates
8 to the plan.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 2024.
