Natural Resources - Maryland State Parks - Funds and Plan Alterations

- 3 FOR the purpose of extending the date by which the Park System Critical Maintenance 4 Fund must be expended; authorizing the Park System Capital Improvements and 5 Acquisition Fund to be used for State projects on lands managed by the Department 6 of Natural Resources for public purposes; altering the allowable uses of funds for the 7 initial allocation to the Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund; 8 authorizing the Great Maryland Outdoors Fund to be used for promoting outdoor 9 environmental education in the State; requiring the Department to report on certain 10 matters at each meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission; extending the date by which the Department is required to develop and publish a Comprehensive 11 12 Long-Range Strategic Plan; and generally relating to the State park system.

The Fund may be used only for:

1	(3) AT LEAST \$20,000,000 for transportation improvements, including:
2 3	(i) Improving bike lanes and trails, increasing walkability, and expanding parking availability; and
4 5	(ii) Targeting transportation investments to avoid capacity shutdowns;
6 7	(4) AT LEAST \$10,000,000 for increasing water access, including kayak and boat launches and areas for picnicking near water and swimming; and
8	(5) UP TO \$30,000,000 for land acquisition, including:
9	(i) Areas in the central and southern regions of the State that will:
10	1. Relieve overcrowding at existing State parks; and
11 12	2. Expand public access to State parks and outdoor recreation;

- 15 (e) (1) The Commission shall meet quarterly to review the status of the Park 16 Service.

 18 COMMISSION ON EXPENDITURES FROM THE PARK SYSTEM CAPITAL
 19 IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITION FUND.

- 21 (a) The Department shall:
- 22 (1) Develop and publish a Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan by 23 December 1, [2023] **2024**;
- 24 (2) Update the Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan every 5 years 25 to reflect major goals and progress toward meeting those goals; and
- 26 (3) Submit to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan and any updates to the plan.
