### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Criminal Law – Visual Surveillance With Prurient Intent – Private Place and 3 Minor Victim

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from conducting visual surveillance with prurient
intent of an individual located in a residence or place of private use or
accommodation without the consent of the individual; altering the penalties for the
crime of visual surveillance with prurient intent by use of a camera if the victim was
a minor at the time of the offense and the offender is at least a certain number of
years older than the victim; and generally relating to the crime of visual surveillance
with prurient intent.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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### Article – Criminal Law

21 (2) "Camera" includes any electronic device that can be used 22 surreptitiously to observe an individual.

(3) "Female breast" means a portion of the female breast below the top ofthe areola.

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1 (f) This section does not affect any legal or equitable right or remedy otherwise 2 provided by law.

3 (g) This section does not affect the application of § 3–901 of this subtitle.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2024.
