County Boards of Education – Bid Advertisement Threshold and Electronic Posting of Hearing Notices and Bid Advertisements

FOR the purpose of authorizing county boards of education to post certain hearing notices
and bid advertisements on the websites of certain local school systems; increasing
the threshold amount of costs of school buildings, improvements, supplies, and
equipment that require county boards to advertise for bids; updating the reference
to the State's centralized procurement platform on which county boards may
advertise for certain bids; and generally relating to county boards of education, the
bid advertisement threshold, and electronic posting of notices and advertisements.
