4 FOR the purpose of authorizing requiring county boards of education to post certain hearing notices and bid advertisements on the websites of certain local school $\mathbf{5}$ 6 systems; increasing the threshold amount of costs of school buildings, improvements, 7 supplies, and equipment that require county boards to advertise for bids; updating the reference to the State's centralized procurement platform on which county boards 8 9 may advertise for certain bids; and generally relating to county boards of education, 10 the bid advertisement threshold, and electronic posting of notices and 11 advertisements.
