- WHEREAS, Drug addiction is a chronic disease, characterized by compulsive or
 difficult-to-control drug use despite harmful consequences; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Drug addiction is seen by both the Centers for Disease Control and 20 Prevention and the World Health Organization as a fast–growing epidemic that can all too 21 easily lead to overdose and death; and
- WHEREAS, For every drug overdose that results in death, there are many more nonfatal overdoses, each taking an emotional and economic toll on the individual, the individual's family, and the community at large; and

1 WHEREAS, Drug addiction can fuel feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment, 2 depression, and hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and support; 3 and

WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on August 31 each year that aims to raise awareness of drug overdoses, reduce the stigma of a drug–related death, and acknowledge the grief felt by families and friends remembering those who have died or had a permanent injury as a result of a drug overdose; and

8 WHEREAS, Recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in Maryland sends a strong 9 message to former or current substance users, namely, that they are valued, and that 10 overdose death is preventable; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That Section(s) 7–416 through 7–420 of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code
 of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–417 through 7–421, respectively.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 15 as follows:

18 THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM AUGUST 31 AS OVERDOSE 19 AWARENESS DAY.
