14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
16	Article - Transportation
17	21–1209.
18	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, the driver of a vehicle shall:
19 20	(1) Exercise due care to avoid colliding with any bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter being ridden by a person; and
$\begin{array}{c} 21 \\ 22 \end{array}$	(2) When overtaking a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter, pass safely at a distance of not less than 3 feet, unless, at the time:



- 1 (i) The bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider fails to operate the 2 vehicle in conformance with § 21–1205(a) of this subtitle ("Riding to right side of roadway") 3 or § 21–1205.1(b) of this subtitle ("Roadway with bike lane or shoulder paved to smooth surface");
- 5 (ii) A passing clearance of less than 3 feet is caused solely by the 6 bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider failing to maintain a steady course; or
- 7 (iii) The highway on which the vehicle is being driven is not wide 8 enough to lawfully pass the bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter at a distance of at least 3 9 feet.
- 10 (b) A person may not throw any object at or in the direction of any person riding 11 a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter.
- 12 (c) A person may not open the door of any motor vehicle with intent to strike, 13 injure, or interfere with any person riding a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter.
- (d) (1) Unless otherwise specified in this title, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right—of—way to a person who is lawfully riding a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter in a designated bike lane or shoulder if the driver of the vehicle is about to enter or cross the designated bike lane or shoulder.
- 18 (2) (I) A PERSON MAY NOT COMMIT A VIOLATION OF PARAGRAPH 19 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT CONTRIBUTES TO A CRASH.
- 20 (II) A PERSON CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SUBPARAGRAPH
 21 (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2 MONTHS
 22 OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,000 OR BOTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
