FOR the purpose of requiring the State to provide to certain non-State-supported 4 employees of the University System of Maryland, and Morgan State University, and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 St. Mary's College of Maryland a certain percentage of the cost–of–living adjustment 7 the State provides to State employees; and generally relating to the University System of Maryland, Morgan State University, and St. Mary's College of Maryland 8 9 in certain fiscal years; requiring certain institutions to submit a report, on or before a certain date, on employee hiring and retention; and generally relating to the 10 11 University System of Maryland and Morgan State University and cost-of-living 12adjustments for non-State-supported employees.
