1 AN ACT concerning

Community Schools – Rental Assistance for Community School Families Program and Fund – Establishment

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Rental Assistance for Community School Families $\mathbf{5}$ Program to provide rental assistance to eligible student households; requiring the 6 State Department of Education, in consultation with the Department of Housing and 7 Community Development, in consultation with the State Department of Education, 8 to administer the Program; establishing the Rental Assistance for Community 9 School Families Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; requiring interest earnings of 10 the Fund to be credited to the Fund; and generally relating to the Rental Assistance 11 for Community School Families Program and Fund.
