2 Commission to Advance Lithium–Ion Battery Safety in Maryland

3	FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission to Advance Lithium-Ion Battery Safety
4	in Maryland; and generally relating to the Commission to Advance Lithium-Ion
5	Battery Safety in Maryland.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 7 That:

- 8 (a) There is a Commission to Advance Lithium–Ion Battery Safety in Maryland.
- 9 (b) The Commission consists of the following members:

3 (g) At the discretion of the Commission, the Commission may seek advice and 4 consultation from outside individuals and entities.

5 (g) (h) (1) On or before December 1, 2024, the Commission shall submit an
6 interim report on the progress and status of the Commission to the Legislative Policy
7 Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article.

8 (2) On or before December 1, 2025, the Commission shall report its findings 9 and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 10 Government Article, the General Assembly.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 12 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months and, at the end of 13 December 31, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall 14 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
