 $R_5$ 4lr1964 HB 1289/23 - ENT CF SB 826 By: Delegates Boyce and Embry Introduced and read first time: January 24, 2024 Assigned to: Environment and Transportation Committee Report: Favorable House action: Adopted Read second time: March 2, 2024 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Vehicle Laws - Bicycles - Operation at Intersections FOR the purpose of authorizing a person operating a bicycle that is approaching a stop sign at an intersection on certain highways to cautiously make a turn or proceed through the intersection without stopping if the person reduces the speed of the bicycle to a reasonable rate and yields the right-of-way to certain vehicles under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the operation of bicycles on highways. BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–707 and 21–1202 Annotated Code of Maryland (2020 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Transportation 21-707.[Unless] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C-1) OF THIS SECTION, AND UNLESS otherwise directed by a police officer or traffic control signal, the driver of a vehicle approaching a stop sign at an intersection shall stop at the near side of the intersection at a clearly marked stop line.

  - (c) [Unless] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C-1) OF THIS SECTION, AND UNLESS otherwise directed by a police officer or traffic control signal, the driver of a vehicle approaching a stop sign at an intersection shall stop at the near side of an intersection and, if there is no crosswalk, at the nearest point before entering the intersection that gives the driver a view of traffic approaching on the intersecting roadway.
- 10 (C-1) WHEN APPROACHING A STOP SIGN AT AN INTERSECTION WITH A
  11 HIGHWAY WITH TWO OR FEWER LANES FOR MOVING TRAFFIC, A PERSON OPERATING

- 23 (e) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign at an intersection, if required 24 for safety to stop, shall stop at the near side of the intersection and, if there is no clearly 25 marked stop line, before entering any crosswalk.
- 26 (f) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign at an intersection, if required 27 for safety to stop, shall stop at the near side of the intersection and, if there is no crosswalk, 28 at the nearest point before entering the intersection that gives the driver a view of traffic 29 approaching on the intersecting roadway.

- 31 (a) Every person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter in a public bicycle area 32 has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver of a vehicle 33 by this title, including the duties set forth in § 21–504 of this title, except:

1	(1) As otherwise provided in this subtitle; and
2	(2) For those provisions of this title that by their very nature cannot apply.
3 4 5	(b) (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, a person has the rights and is subject to the restrictions applicable to pedestrians under this title while the person is lawfully operating a bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle:
6	(i) On a sidewalk or sidewalk area; or
7	(ii) In or through a crosswalk.
8	(2) At an intersection, a person operating a bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle is subject to all traffic control signals, as provided in §§ 21–202 and 21–203 of this title.
