#### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Motor Vehicles – Work Zone Speed Control Systems – Revisions (Maryland Road Worker Protection Act of 2024)

4 FOR the purpose of altering the distribution of revenue from civil fines collected through 5 the use of work zone speed control systems to include certain distributions for 6 highway and work zone safety purposes; clarifying the highways on which a work 7 zone speed control system may be used; clarifying that a work zone speed control 8 system may be manned or unmanned and a system operator does not need to be 9 present when a work zone speed control system is in use; clarifying that multiple 10 work zone speed control systems may be implemented and used in a work zone; altering the maximum penalty for a civil citation issued as a result of a recorded 11 12 image produced by a work zone speed control system; repealing a requirement that warning notices be issued for violations recorded by a work zone speed control system 13 during certain periods of time; and generally relating to work zone speed control 14 15 systems.

22 23	(a) Except as specifically provided by law, all money received under the Maryland Vehicle Law shall be accounted for and remitted to the State Comptroller.
24 25 26 27	(c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, notwithstanding any other law and in addition to any other exceptions provided by law, all costs, fines, penalties, and forfeitures received by or paid to the District Court under the Maryland Vehicle Law shall be collected and remitted as provided in the Courts Article.
28 29 30	(2) The Comptroller shall distribute revenue from the civil fines collected through use of a work zone speed control system under § 21–810 of this article to a special fund, to be used only as provided in subsection (e) of this section.
31	(e) Money in the special fund established under subsection (c)(2) of this section:
32 33 34	(1) Shall be distributed first to the Department of State Police and the State Highway Administration to cover the costs of implementing and administering work zone speed control systems; [and]

- 1 After the distribution under item (1) of this subsection, 25% OF ANY (2) 2 REMAINING BALANCE shall be distributed to the Department of State Police to be used 3 only for the purchase of replacement vehicles and related motor vehicle equipment used to 4 outfit police vehicles; AND AFTER THE DISTRIBUTIONS UNDER ITEMS (1) AND (2) OF THIS 5 **(3)** 6 SUBSECTION, THE REMAINING BALANCE SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE TRANSPORTATION TRUST FUND FOR HIGHWAY AND WORK ZONE SAFETY PURPOSES. 7 8 21 - 810.9 A work zone speed control system that meets the requirements of this subsection may be used to record the images of motor vehicles traveling on a highway: 10 11 (i) Within a work zone; 12 (ii) That is an expressway or a controlled access highway as defined 13 in § 21–101 of this title; and 14 (iii) On which the speed limit, AS POSTED BEFORE THE WORK 15 ZONE WAS IMPLEMENTED AND established using generally accepted traffic engineering 16 practices, is 45 miles per hour or greater. 17 (2)(I)A work zone speed control system may be used only: 18 (i) 1. On a highway as specified in paragraph (1) of this 19 subsection: AND 20 (ii) When being operated by a work zone speed control system 21 operator; and 22 (iii) **2.** If, in accordance with the Maryland manual on uniform traffic control devices, a conspicuous road sign is placed at a reasonable distance consistent 23with national guidelines before the work zone alerting drivers that a speed monitoring 2425system may be in operation in the work zone. A WORK ZONE SPEED CONTROL SYSTEM MAY BE 26 (II)1. 27 MANNED OR UNMANNED.
- 28 2. A WORK ZONE SPEED CONTROL SYSTEM OPERATOR
  DOES NOT NEED TO BE PRESENT IN PERSON OR REMOTELY AT THE HIGHWAY WORK
  ZONE WHEN A WORK ZONE SPEED CONTROL SYSTEM IS IN USE.
- 31 (III) 1. MULTIPLE WORK ZONE SPEED CONTROL SYSTEMS 32 MAY BE IMPLEMENTED AND USED IN A WORK ZONE.

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1 2 3 4	2. IF A WORK ZONE HAS MORE THAN ONE WORK ZONE SPEED CONTROL SYSTEM IN USE, NOT MORE THAN ONE CITATION WITHIN A 1-HOUR PERIOD MAY BE ISSUED FOR THE SAME REGISTRATION PLATE FOR A VIOLATION IN THE WORK ZONE.

(II) ANY LEGISLATIVE OR REGULATORY CHANGES THAT WOULD

BE NECESSARY TO AUTHORIZE THE EFFECTIVE USE OF THE DEVICE.

[(k)] (L) The Department of State Police and the State Highway Administration jointly shall adopt regulations establishing standards and procedures for work zone speed control systems authorized under this section.

#### Chapter 500 of the Acts of 2009

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, during the 30-day period after the first work zone speed control system is in place, a law enforcement agency may issue warnings[, but may not issue citations,] **OR CITATIONS** for violations enforced in accordance with § 21–810 of the Transportation Article, as enacted by this Act.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 10 as follows:

### Article - Transportation

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- 13 (c) (1) Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 14 officer at the time of the violation, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (f)(4) of this 15 section, the driver of a motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if an image of the motor 16 vehicle is recorded by a work zone speed control system in accordance with subsection (b) 17 of this section while being operated in violation of this subtitle.
- 18 (2) A civil penalty under this subsection may not exceed [\$290]:
- 19 (I) FOR A FIRST OR SECOND OFFENSE IN A CALENDAR YEAR, 20 \$290; AND
- 21 (II) FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE IN A 22 CALENDAR YEAR, \$1,000.
- 23 (3) For purposes of this section, the District Court shall:
- 24 (i) Prescribe a uniform citation form consistent with subsection 25 (d)(1) of this section and § 7–302 of the Courts Article; and
- 26 (ii) Indicate on the citation the amount of the civil penalty to be paid 27 by persons who choose to prepay the civil penalty without appearing in District Court.
- (d) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) through (4) of this subsection, a local police department, State police department, or police department contractor shall mail to the owner liable under subsection (c) of this section a citation that shall include:

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1	(x) Information advising the person alleged to be liable under this
<b>2</b>	section of the manner and time in which liability as alleged in the citation may be contested
3	in the District Court; [and]
4 5	(xi) Information advising the person alleged to be liable under this section that failure to pay the civil penalty or to contest liability in a timely manner:
6	1. Is an admission of liability;
7	2. May result in the refusal to register the motor vehicle; and
8	3. May result in the suspension of the motor vehicle
9	registration; AND
10	(XII) NOTICE OF THE INCREASED MAXIMUM CIVIL PENALTY
11	APPLICABLE FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE IN THE SAME CALENDAR YEAR
12	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take
13	effect January 1, 2025.
14 15	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2024.
