## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Election Law – Local Boards of Elections – Language–Related Assistance

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections to determine whether there is a significant and substantial need for language-related assistance in certain languages by a local board of elections during an election based on certain criteria; requiring local boards to provide certain language-related assistance and materials in voting and elections to certain voters in certain languages; requiring the State Board to establish a telephone interpreter hotline; and generally relating to language-related assistance.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18Article Election Law
- 19 TITLE 15.5. LANGUAGE–RELATED ASSISTANCE.

(A) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE BOARD
SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER THERE IS A SIGNIFICANT AND SUBSTANTIAL NEED
FOR LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE IN ONE OR MORE LANGUAGES OTHER THAN
ENGLISH BY A LOCAL BOARD DURING AN ELECTION.

1 (B) THE STATE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THAT A SIGNIFICANT AND 2 SUBSTANTIAL NEED FOR LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE BY A LOCAL BOARD 3 DURING AN ELECTION EXISTS IN A COUNTY IF, BASED ON THE BEST AVAILABLE 4 DATA, INCLUDING INFORMATION FROM THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU'S AMERICAN 5 COMMUNITY SURVEY OR DATA OF COMPARABLE QUALITY COLLECTED BY A PUBLIC 6 OFFICE:

7 (1) MORE THAN 2%, BUT IN NO INSTANCE FEWER THAN 100 8 INDIVIDUALS, OF THE VOTING AGE POPULATION OF THE COUNTY:

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(I) SPEAK A PARTICULAR LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH;

10(II) DOES NOT SPEAK ENGLISH AS THEIR PRIMARY LANGUAGE;11AND

12 (III) SPEAKS, READS, OR UNDERSTANDS THE ENGLISH 13 LANGUAGE LESS THAN "VERY WELL", AS REPORTED IN AVAILABLE U.S. CENSUS 14 BUREAU DATA OR DATA OF COMPARABLE QUALITY COLLECTED BY A PUBLIC 15 OFFICE; OR

16 (2) MORE THAN 4,000 INDIVIDUALS OF THE VOTING AGE POPULATION 17 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SPEAK A PARTICULAR LANGUAGE OTHER THAN 18 ENGLISH AND ARE LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENT.

19 (C) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH 20 ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING WHETHER A SIGNIFICANT AND 21 SUBSTANTIAL NEED FOR LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE BY A LOCAL BOARD 22 DURING AN ELECTION EXISTS IN A COUNTY.

(A) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2025, AND EVERY 2 YEARS THEREAFTER,
 THE STATE BOARD SHALL PUBLISH AND MAINTAIN ON ITS WEBSITE A LIST OF:

26 (1) EACH LOCAL BOARD THAT IS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE 27 LANGUAGE–RELATED ASSISTANCE IN A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH; AND

28 (2) THE TYPE OF LANGUAGE–RELATED ASSISTANCE THAT IS 29 REQUIRED TO BE PROVIDED BY THE LOCAL BOARD.

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1 (B) THE STATE BOARD SHALL DISTRIBUTE THIS LIST TO EACH LOCAL 2 BOARD IN TIME TO ALLOW LOCAL BOARDS TO PROVIDE LANGUAGE-RELATED 3 ASSISTANCE UNDER § 15.5–103 OF THIS TITLE.

5 (A) A LOCAL BOARD SHALL PROVIDE LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE 6 AND MATERIALS IN VOTING AND ELECTIONS TO LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENT 7 VOTERS IN EACH LANGUAGE DESIGNATED BY THE STATE BOARD UNDER § 15.5–101 8 OF THIS TITLE.

9 (B) WHENEVER THE STATE BOARD DETERMINES THAT 10 LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY A LOCAL BOARD, THE 11 LOCAL BOARD SHALL PROVIDE COMPETENT ASSISTANCE AND PHYSICAL AND 12 ONLINE VOTING MATERIALS IN EACH DESIGNATED LANGUAGE UNDER § 15.5–101 OF 13 THIS TITLE.

14 (C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, 15 FOR EACH DESIGNATED LANGUAGE UNDER § 15.5–101 OF THIS TITLE, THE 16 LANGUAGE–RELATED ASSISTANCE AND MATERIALS SHALL INCLUDE:

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- (I) **REGISTRATION AND VOTING NOTICES;**
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(II) ELECTION-RELATED FORMS AND INSTRUCTIONS;

19(III) SIGNAGE AT ALL EARLY VOTING CENTERS AND POLLING20PLACES IN DESIGNATED LANGUAGES NOTIFYING VOTERS THAT LANGUAGE21ASSISTANCE AND TELEPHONE INTERPRETERS ARE AVAILABLE; AND

22 (IV) BALLOTS AND OTHER MATERIALS OR INFORMATION 23 RELATING TO THE ELECTORAL PROCESS.

(2) IN THE CASE OF A LANGUAGE THAT IS ORAL OR UNWRITTEN, THE
 LOCAL BOARD MAY PROVIDE ONLY ORAL INSTRUCTIONS, ASSISTANCE, OR OTHER
 INFORMATION RELATING TO THE ELECTORAL PROCESS IN THE APPLICABLE
 LANGUAGE.

28 (D) (1) MATERIALS PROVIDED IN A DESIGNATED LANGUAGE SHALL BE OF 29 AN EQUAL QUALITY TO THE CORRESPONDING ENGLISH LANGUAGE MATERIALS.

30 (2) ALL TRANSLATIONS SHALL CONVEY THE INTENT AND ESSENTIAL
 31 MEANING OF THE ORIGINAL TEXT OR COMMUNICATION AND MAY NOT SOLELY RELY
 32 ON AUTOMATIC ELECTRONIC TRANSLATION SERVICES.

1 (3) IN ADDITION TO THE OTHER REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION, 2 LANGUAGE-RELATED ASSISTANCE SHALL INCLUDE THE PRESENCE OF BILINGUAL 3 ELECTION JUDGES WHERE AVAILABLE.

5 (A) (1) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A TELEPHONE 6 INTERPRETER HOTLINE TO BE MADE AVAILABLE AT LEAST DURING EACH EARLY 7 VOTING PERIOD AND ON EACH ELECTION DAY WITH INTERPRETERS AVAILABLE IN 8 EACH LANGUAGE THAT HAS BEEN DESIGNATED IN THE STATE.

9 (2) THE TELEPHONE INTERPRETER HOTLINE ESTABLISHED UNDER
10 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL PROVIDE SUPPORT TO LOCAL BOARDS
11 TO MEET LANGUAGE–RELATED ASSISTANCE REQUIREMENTS.

19 (A) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH A 20 REVIEW PROCESS TO DETERMINE WHETHER A SIGNIFICANT AND SUBSTANTIAL 21 NEED EXISTS FOR A LANGUAGE TO BE DESIGNATED UNDER § 15.5–101 OF THIS 22 TITLE.

(B) THE PROCESS ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE BOARD UNDER SUBSECTION

THAT THE LOCAL BOARD IS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE LANGUAGE-RELATED
ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS TITLE, THE LOCAL BOARD MAY FILE AN ACTION AGAINST
THE STATE BOARD SEEKING A DECLARATORY JUDGMENT ALLOWING THE LOCAL
BOARD TO PROVIDE ONLY ENGLISH LANGUAGE MATERIALS.

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1 (2) THE COURT SHALL ENTER THE DECLARATORY JUDGMENT IN 2 FAVOR OF THE LOCAL BOARD ONLY IF THE COURT FINDS THAT THE DETERMINATION 3 BY THE STATE BOARD WAS ARBITRARY AND CAPRICIOUS OR AN ABUSE OF 4 DISCRETION.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 January 1, 2025.
