SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That: (a) There is a Police Recruitment and Retention Workgroup. (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members: (1)one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the Chair of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee; (2)one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Chair of the House Judiciary Committee; (3)the Secretary of the Department of State Police, or the Secretary's designee; **(4)** the Public Defender, or the Public Defender's designee;
