BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 7–439 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 7-439.In this section, "nonpublic school" means a noncollegiate educational (a) institution that:
