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1 (f) (1) An individual who serves beer, wine, and liquor on the licensed 2 premises shall hold a certificate from an alcohol awareness program that the Board 3 approves.

4 (2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, an individual may 5 serve beer, wine, and liquor during a baseball game.

6 (ii) An individual may serve beer, wine, and liquor in a glass 7 container only on the club level, in an area in the stadium designated by the license holder 8 to hold a special event, or in a dining area where patrons are seated.

9 (3) (i) This paragraph does not apply to wine and liquor served on the 10 club level, in an area in the stadium designated by the license holder to hold a special event, 11 or in a dining area where patrons are seated.

(ii) An individual may dispense wine and liquor during a baseball
game only from a stationary structure that is in the stadium and equipped with a motor
vehicle driver's license scanner.

15 (4) A license holder may not allow a roving vendor to dispense wine and 16 liquor.

17 (5) A license holder may not allow a person to carry beer, wine, and liquor 18 onto or off of the licensed premises.

19 (g) The annual license fee is **[**\$10,000] **\$4,000** *§***7,000**.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 21 1, 2024.
