## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program – Program Administrator – 3 Alterations 4 FOR the purpose of altering the administrator of the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland 5 Program to be the Maryland Higher Education Commission rather than the State 6 Department of Education; and generally relating to the Next Generation Scholars of 7 Maryland Program. 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 9 Article – Education 10 Section 18-303.1 11 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) 12 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 Article - Education 15 18-303.1. 16 In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 17 (a) (1) 18 (2)"Fund" means the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program 19 Fund. 20 (3)"Program" means the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program.

- 4 1 The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of **(4)** 2 the State Finance and Procurement Article. 3 (5)The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the Comptroller shall account for the Fund. 4 The Fund consists of: 5 (6) 6 Money appropriated in the State budget for the Program; (i) 7 (ii) Interest earnings of the Fund; and Any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit 8 (iii) 9 of the Fund. 10 (7)The Fund may be used only for administering the Program. 11 (8)(i) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same manner as other State money may be invested. 12 Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund. 13 (ii) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the 14 (9)15 State budget. 16 The [Department] COMMISSION may adopt regulations necessary to 17 implement this section. - 9 (7) The amount of financial aid, in addition to the Guaranteed Access 10 Grant, that participating students received each year that the students were enrolled in an 11 institution of higher education; and
- 12 (8) Findings and recommendations on the success of the Program and whether funding for the Program should be continued or expanded.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to the program administrator of the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program for the fiscal year 2025 grant cycle.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
