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- 1 (6) EACH FACILITY AT WHICH A YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM HOLDS A 2 PRACTICE OR AN EVENT SHALL PROCURE AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL 3 DEFIBRILLATOR THAT THE YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM MAY USE TO SATISFY THE 4 REQUIREMENT UNDER PARAGRAPH (4)(1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
 - [(d)] **(E)** Before a youth sports program may use a facility owned or operated by a local government, the local government shall provide notice to the youth sports program of the requirements of this section.
