3 FOR the purpose of repealing the prohibition against a person using or possessing with 4 intent to use, delivering or selling under certain circumstances, or manufacturing or $\mathbf{5}$ possessing with intent to deliver or sell under certain circumstances drug 6 paraphernalia to inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body 7 a controlled dangerous substance; altering a prohibition against a person possessing 8 or distributing controlled paraphernalia under circumstances that reasonably 9 indicate an intention to use the controlled paraphernalia for certain purposes; altering a list of certain items that indicate intent to use certain controlled 1011 paraphernalia for certain purposes; and generally relating to drug paraphernalia.
