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1 In fiscal year 2025 and in each fiscal year thereafter, the Governor shall 2 include funds in the State budget to implement this section, including funds to: 3 (1) employ a full-time assistant Attorney General to staff the Commission; and 4 5 (2) operate and maintain the office. 6 A majority of members of the Commission shall constitute a guorum for (f) (1) 7 the transaction of business. 8 (2)The Commission may adopt rules governing the administration and 9 proceedings of the Commission. A member of the Commission: 10 (g) 11 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but 12 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 13 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
