### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Commission on Hate Crime Response and Prevention – Membership – 3 Alterations

# FOR the purpose of removing the representative of the Council on American–Islamic Relations Maryland Office from the Commission on Hate Crime Response and Prevention; adding two members of the Muslim community to be appointed by the Attorney General to the Commission; and generally relating to the membership of the Commission on Hate Crime Response and Prevention.

## SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial 5 members appointed to the Commission on Hate Crime Response and Prevention under § 6 6–802(b)(6) of the State Government Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall expire 7 as follows:

- 8 (1) one member in 2025; and
- 9 (2) one member in 2028.

10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2024.
