1 AN ACT concerning

State Lottery Fund – Bus Rapid Transit Fund Distribution <u>and Prince George's</u> <u>County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund</u> – Alterations

FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the distribution of up to a certain 4 amount of money from the State Lottery Fund to the Bus Rapid Transit Fund for $\mathbf{5}$ 6 certain bus rapid transit system grants; altering the circumstances for distributions 7 from the Bus Rapid Transit Fund; adding an authorized use for the Prince George's 8 County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund; altering distributions to the Prince 9 George's County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund in certain fiscal years; requiring the Maryland Stadium Authority to submit a certain report, on or before a certain 10 date, on certain activities in the Prince George's County Blue Line Corridor; and 11 12generally relating to the State Lottery Fund and, the Bus Rapid Transit Fund, and the Prince George's County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund. 13
