- 4 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the distribution of up to a certain $\mathbf{5}$ amount of money from the State Lottery Fund to the Bus Rapid Transit Fund for 6 certain bus rapid transit system grants; altering the circumstances for distributions 7 from the Bus Rapid Transit Fund; adding an authorized use for the Prince George's County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund; altering distributions to the Prince 8 9 George's County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund in certain fiscal years; requiring 10 the Maryland Stadium Authority to submit a certain report, on or before a certain 11 date, on certain activities in the Prince George's County Blue Line Corridor; and generally relating to the State Lottery Fund and, the Bus Rapid Transit Fund, and 12 13the Prince George's County Blue Line Corridor Facility Fund.
