- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 3 (1) THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE 4 PARK CAMPUS; OR
- 5 (2) THE PRESIDENT OF MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY.
- 6 (C) "PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION" MEANS THE 7 UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK CAMPUS AND MORGAN STATE 8 UNIVERSITY.
- 9 (D) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE FINANCIAL WELL-BEING PILOT 10 PROGRAM.

- 22 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE 23 COMPREHENSIVE FINANCIAL GUIDANCE, SUPPORT, AND COACHING TO HELP

- 17 (IV) ASSIST STUDENTS IN MANAGING PERSONAL FINANCIAL
- 18 OBLIGATIONS DURING COLLEGE AND AFTER GRADUATION;
- 19 (2) WHILE PROVIDING THE SUPPORT SERVICES LISTED IN ITEM (1)

- 19 (III) LACK FINANCIAL SKILLS AND FINANCIAL LITERACY

- 22 (A) (1) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1, 2025, EACH PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION
- 23 OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL SUBMIT AN INTERIM REPORT TO THE COMMISSION
- 24 ON THE STATUS AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 25 (2) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1, 2026, EACH PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION
- 26 OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL SUBMIT A FINAL REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON

9	31, 2027, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
10	abrogated and of no further force and effect.
