15(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

"Transportation network company" means a company that operates in the 16 (1)17State using a digital network to connect passengers to transportation network operators or 18 transportation network partners for transportation network services.

19"Transportation network operator", "transportation network partner", or (m)"transportation network driver" means an individual who: 20

21has been issued a transportation network operator's license, or is (1)otherwise authorized, by the Commission to provide transportation network services; 22

23(2)receives, through a transportation network company's digital network application, a connection to a potential passenger to transport the passenger between 24points chosen by the passenger in exchange for the payment of a fee to the transportation 2526network company; and
