- FOR the purpose of requiring that the conflict of interest provisions enacted by Calvert 4 5 County include certain provisions relating to judicial relief for certain violations of 6 the county's conflict of interest provisions; requiring the ethics provisions enacted by 7 Calvert County to include a provision requiring the Calvert County Ethics Commission to make public any recommendation it makes to expel a Commissioner; 8 9 requiring Calvert County to enact a law or regulation to require that authorizes the 10 removal of a county elected official from office for violations of certain conflict of 11 interest provisions; and generally relating to conflict of interest and expulsion 12 provisions in Calvert County.
