1 AN ACT concerning

Environment – Plastic Bottle Waste Reduction – Water Bottle Filling Stations and Reporting

- FOR the purpose of requiring that a water bottle filling station be installed in certain new
 construction beginning on a certain date; requiring the Department of the
 Environment to conduct a certain survey, gather certain data, and identify certain
 methods on or before a certain date; and generally relating to plastic bottle waste
 reduction.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 SUBTITLE 26. PLASTIC BOTTLE WASTE REDUCTION.

3 (B) "PLASTIC BOTTLE" MEANS A PLASTIC CONTAINER INTENDED FOR 4 SINGLE USE THAT:

5 (1) HAS A NECK THAT IS SMALLER THAN THE CONTAINER;

6 (2) ACCEPTS A SCREW TYPE, SNAP CAP, OR OTHER SIMILAR 7 CLOSURE; AND

8 (3) HAS A CAPACITY OF 1 LITER OR LESS.

9 (C) (1) "WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATION" MEANS A PLUMBING FIXTURE 10 CONNECTED TO THE POTABLE WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM AND SANITARY 11 DRAINAGE SYSTEM THAT IS DESIGNED AND INTENDED FOR FILLING PERSONAL USE 12 WATER BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS AT LEAST 10 INCHES IN HEIGHT₇: AND

13 (2) "WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATION" INCLUDES:

14(I)A STATION THAT IS SEPARATE FROM OR INTEGRAL TO A15DRINKING FOUNTAIN; AND

16 (II) A STATION THAT INCORPORATES A WATER FILTER AND 17 COOLING SYSTEM FOR CHILLING THE WATER.

19 BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024, A WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATION OR A 20 COMBINED WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATION AND DRINKING FOUNTAIN SHALL BE 21 INSTALLED IN ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION FOR WHICH A DRINKING FOUNTAIN IS 22 REQUIRED UNDER THE CURRENT VERSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING 23 CODE OR STATE OR LOCAL LAW OR REGULATION.

25THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF LABOR SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO26CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

28(a)In this section, "plastic bottle" means a plastic container intended for single29use that:

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1	(1) has a neck that is smaller than the container;
2	(2) accepts a screw-type, snap cap, or other similar closure; and
3	(3) has a capacity of 1 liter or less.
4	(a) (b) On or before October 1, 2025, the Department of the Environment shall:
5 6 7	(1) survey and gather data from each unit of State government and institution of higher education on the quantity and volume of plastic <u>water</u> bottles purchased during the 2024 calendar year; and
8 9	(2) identify potential alternative methods for providing drinking water, including the installation and use of water bottle filling stations.
10	(b) (c) On or before December 1, 2025, the Department of the Environment shall:

$\begin{array}{c} 13\\14\\15\end{array}$	(2) submit the survey and alternative methods identified under subsection (a) (b) of this section to the Governor and, in accordance with § $2-1257$ of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
16 17 18	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any new construction under contract before the effective date of this Act.
19 20	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
