#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Human Services - Universal Basic Income for Transition-Age Youth Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Universal Basic Income for Transition-Age Youth
Program in the Department of Human Services; providing that payments made
under the Program may not be considered income or resources for purposes of
determining eligibility for certain benefits; requiring the Department to report
annually on the Program to the General Assembly; and generally relating to the
Universal Basic Income for Transition-Age Youth Program.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 Article Human Services
- 19 SUBTITLE 5C. UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME FOR TRANSITION-AGE YOUTH.

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1 (B) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME FOR 2 TRANSITION-AGE YOUTH PROGRAM.

3 (C) "UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME" MEANS UNCONDITIONAL CASH PAYMENTS 4 OF EQUAL AMOUNTS DISTRIBUTED MONTHLY TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.

5 **5–5C–02.** 

6 (A) THERE IS A UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME FOR TRANSITION-AGE YOUTH 7 PROGRAM WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.

8 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE FOR THE ECONOMIC 9 SECURITY OF INDIVIDUALS AGING OUT OF THE OUT-OF-HOME PLACEMENT 10 PROGRAM.

11 **5–5C–03.** 

12 (A) AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR A UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME 13 OF \$1,000 PER MONTH FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS IF:

14(1) THE INDIVIDUAL RESIDED IN AN OUT-OF-HOME PLACEMENT ON15THE INDIVIDUAL'S 18TH BIRTHDAY, REGARDLESS OF THE AGE AT WHICH THE16INDIVIDUAL ENTERED OUT-OF-HOME PLACEMENT; AND

17(2) THE INDIVIDUAL'S 18TH BIRTHDAY IS ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1,182022.

19 **(B)** PAYMENTS ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSIDERED 20 INCOME OR RESOURCES FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE 21 BENEFITS OR THE AMOUNTS OF BENEFITS RECEIVED FOR THE FOLLOWING, AS 22 PERMITTED BY FEDERAL LAW:

(1) THE MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM;

- (2) THE MARYLAND EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT; OR

25(3)STATE AND FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID AND COLLEGE SUPPORT26PROGRAMS.

27 **5–5C–04.** 

28 ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND EACH OCTOBER 1 THEREAFTER, THE 29 DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN 1 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THAT 2 CONTAINS DESCRIPTIVE INFORMATION AND OUTCOME MEASURES OF PROGRAM 3 RECIPIENTS DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR, INCLUDING, AT A MINIMUM:

4 (1) THE STARTING INCOME OF EACH RECIPIENT, EXCLUSIVE OF 5 UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME PAYMENTS;

6 (2) GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION ABOUT EACH RECIPIENT, INCLUDING 7 COUNTY, CITY, AND ZIP CODE OF RESIDENCE;

8 (3) THE EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF EACH RECIPIENT BEFORE 9 RECEIVING UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME PAYMENTS; AND

10 (4) THE HOUSING STATUS OF EACH RECIPIENT BEFORE RECEIVING 11 UNIVERSAL BASIC INCOME PAYMENTS.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 14 30, 2029, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 15 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
