BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 5–231 and 7–1A–04 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 5-231.The Head Start Program in the State shall be referred to as the Ulysses Currie Head Start Program.

- 20 (3) Submit to the Department a plan to achieve a quality rating level 5 in the Maryland EXCELS program within 5 years after becoming an eligible prekindergarten provider;
- 23 (4) Achieve in accordance with the plan a quality rating level 5 in the 24 Maryland EXCELS program within 5 years after becoming an eligible prekindergarten 25 provider and publish that quality rating in a publicly available manner, determined by the 26 Department; and
- 27 (5) Except as otherwise provided in § 7–1A–07 of this subtitle, be open for 28 pupil attendance in accordance with § 7–103 of this title.
