1 AN ACT concerning

Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best Practices and Innovation Network

FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best Practices and Innovation Network; and generally relating to the Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best Practices and Innovation Network.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,8 That:
