- 7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 8 That:
- 9 (a) There is a Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best 10 Practices and Innovation Network.
- 11 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 12 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of
- 13 the Senate;
- 14 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
- 15 House;
- 16 (3) the Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee;

The Workgroup shall elect a chair from among its members.

1 2	(d) The University of Maryland, Baltimore County shall provide staff for the Workgroup.
3	(e) A member of the Workgroup:
4	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but
5 6	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
7	(f) The Workgroup shall:
8 9 10	(1) identify and analyze options for establishing and maintaining *\an open access science, technology, and innovation network *\opensf{f} or hub of citizen scientists and experts in science, technology, and industry to:
11	(i) facilitate <u>noninstitutional</u> voluntary collaboration;
12 13	(ii) facilitate the open exchange of <u>ideas and nonproprietary</u> state–of–the–art and evidence–based data and information; <u>and</u>
14	(iii) inform State policy and practices; and
15 16	(iv) (iii) promote solution development and decision making based on sound science, innovation, and best practices;
17	(2) identify and evaluate methods for:
18 19	(i) establishing a digital or virtual referral network of experts in science, technology, and industry, including expansion of existing entities and networks;
20	(ii) registering expert participants; and
21	(iii) making network expertise available to the public; and
22 23	(3) examine the costs of developing and maintaining a network of experts in science, technology, and industry; and
24 25	(4) (3) make recommendations regarding the establishment of a science and technology best practices and innovation network.
26 27 28	(g) On or before December 1, 2024, the Workgroup shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with \S 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June

1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June
