1 AN ACT concerning

Physicians - Licensing - Foreign Practicing Physicians

3 FOR the purpose of exempting a foreign practicing physician applicant for a license from 4 certain education requirements under certain circumstances; requiring the State 5 Board of Physicians to establish a consortium of postgraduate medical education 6 programs for the purpose of developing, implementing, and administering an 7 examination to assess the ability of a foreign practicing physician to meet the 8 standard of care for the independent practice of medicine; requiring a foreign 9 practicing physician to pass a certain examination as a condition of the initial license 10 renewal; and generally relating to the licensing of foreign practicing physicians.

- 14 (ii) Was a United States citizen when the student enrolled in the 15 foreign medical school; and
- 16 (iii) Has completed all of the formal requirements for graduation 17 from the foreign medical school, except for any social service or postgraduate requirements.
- 18 (3) "Foreign medical school" means a medical school located outside of the United States, its territories or possessions, Puerto Rico, or Canada.
- 20 (4) "FOREIGN PRACTICING PHYSICIAN APPLICANT" MEANS AN 21 INDIVIDUAL WHO GRADUATED FROM A FOREIGN MEDICAL SCHOOL AND SUBMITS 22 EVIDENCE ACCEPTABLE TO THE BOARD THAT THE APPLICANT:
