(a) There is a Workgroup for the Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing.

(b) (1) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

(i) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;

(ii) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

(iii) the Director of the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, or the Director's designee; and

(iv) 10 community representatives of State or local nonprofit organizations for deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals in the State or the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, appointed by the Governor.

(2) To the extent practicable, when appointing members to the Workgroup, the Governor shall ensure geographic balance and promote racial and gender diversity in the Workgroup's membership.

(c) The members of the Workgroup shall elect a chair from among the members of the Workgroup.

(d) The Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing shall provide staff for the Workgroup.

1 (e) The Workgroup shall:

2 (1) establish subcommittees as necessary to fulfill its duties; and

3 (2) assign members as necessary to assist in the research and preparation
4 of the report submitted under subsection (h) of this section.

5 (f) A member of the Workgroup:

6 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

7 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
8 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

9 (g) The Workgroup shall study, assess, and make recommendations regarding:

10 (1) providing direct and specialized case management services for deaf,
11 deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals;

12 (2) the development and administration of programs that support
13 educational, employment, health, and social opportunities for deaf, deafblind, and hard of
14 hearing individuals;

15 (3) advocacy for policies, programs, and legislative initiatives that address
16 the needs of and issues affecting deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals;

17 (4) outreach efforts to raise public awareness and foster understanding of
18 the challenges encountered by deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals;

19 (5) coordination with State agencies and utilization of State resources to
20 provide specialized case management services to meet the needs of deaf, deafblind, and
21 hard of hearing individuals;

22 (6) identification of barriers and gaps in communication access and
23 development of solutions to improve the quality of life of deaf, deafblind, and hard of
24 hearing individuals; and

25 (7) development of activities to enhance civic engagement between deaf,
26 deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals and the community.

27 (h) On or before June 1, 2025, the Workgroup shall submit a report of its findings
28 and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State
29 Government Article, the General Assembly.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 ~~October~~ July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June

1 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
