1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Safety – Automatic License Plate Readers – Captured Plate Data <u>Storage</u> and <u>Upload</u>

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "historical data" to include automatic license plate reader data stored by cloud computing; establishing that certain captured automatic license plate reader data is the property of a certain law enforcement agency and may not be sold for any purpose; establishing that certain captured automatic license plate reader data may be uploaded to the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center; extending a certain offense relating to license plate reader data to apply to a vendor contracted by a law enforcement agency; and generally relating to automatic license plate readers.
