## **HOUSE BILL 1081**

1 "Historical data" means any data collected by an automatic license plate (6) 2 reader system and stored: 3 in an automatic license plate reader database operated by OR (I)FOR the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center or by OR FOR a law enforcement 4 5 agency; OR 6 (II) THROUGH CLOUD COMPUTING. 7 (b) (1) A law enforcement agency may not use captured plate data unless the 8 agency has a legitimate law enforcement purpose. 9 **(2)** AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE DATA CAPTURED IN ACCORDANCE 10 WITH THIS SECTION: IS THE PROPERTY OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY; 11 **(I)** 12 AND 13 (II) MAY NOT BE SOLD FOR ANY PURPOSE. 14 [(2)] **(3)** An employee of a law enforcement agency who violates this subsection is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$10,000 15 16 or both. 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2024.
