1 (B) (1) THERE IS A STATEWIDE SECURE SCHOOLS EMERGENCY 2 RESPONSE PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE CENTER.

3 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO IMPROVE THE SAFETY AND
4 SECURITY OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE STATE BY IMPLEMENTING A STATEWIDE
5 EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM THAT FACILITATES COMMUNICATION BETWEEN

18 (F) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2026, THE CENTER SHALL ENSURE 19 THAT THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED IN EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE 20 STATE.

21 (2) (I) A PUBLIC SCHOOL WITH AN EXISTING PROGRAM THAT IS 22 SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM MAY SUBMIT A REQUEST TO THE 23 CENTER TO OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM.

(II) IF THE CENTER DETERMINES THAT A PUBLIC SCHOOL'S
EXISTING PROGRAM IS SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM, THE CENTER
SHALL GRANT THE SCHOOL'S REQUEST TO OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM.

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31 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

"First responder" means an employee of a State or local public safety 1 (j) (1) $\mathbf{2}$ agency that provides emergency response services. 3 (2)"First responder" includes: 4 (i) a firefighter;  $\mathbf{5}$ (ii) a paramedic; 6 (iii) an emergency medical technician; 7 a rescue squad member; (iv) 8 a sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal; (v) 9 (vi) a member of a volunteer fire or rescue company who is a covered 10 employee under § 9–234 of the Labor and Employment Article; 11 an individual who is licensed or certified under § 13-516 of the (vii) 12Education Article: and 13(viii) a 9–1–1 specialist. 14"Public safety agency" means: (t) 15a functional division of a public agency that provides fire fighting, (1)16 police, medical, or other emergency services; or 17(2)a private entity that provides fire fighting, police, medical, or other 18emergency services on a voluntary basis. 19"Public safety answering point" means a communications facility that: (u) 20(1)is operated on a 24-hour basis; first receives 9-1-1 requests for emergency services in a 9-1-1 service 21(2)22area; and 23(3)as appropriate: 24dispatches public safety services directly; (i) 25(ii) transmits incident data to appropriate public safety agencies 26within the State for the dispatch of public safety services; or

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 9 1, 2024.
