21 (2) "PROVIDER" MEANS A SCHOOL AUDIOLOGIST, SCHOOL 22 PSYCHOLOGIST, SCHOOL SPEECH PATHOLOGIST, AND ANY OTHER HEALTH CARE 23 PRACTITIONER WHO PROVIDES SERVICES TO A STUDENT IN A SCHOOL SETTING.

1 (3) "REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS" MEANS FUNDS RECEIVED BY AN 2 ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL, OR A COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM, FOR 3 SERVICES PROVIDED IN A SCHOOL SETTING TO AN INDIVIDUAL ENROLLED IN THE 4 MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM OR THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S 5 HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM.

6 (B) AN ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL, OR A COUNTY SCHOOL 7 SYSTEM, SHALL USE REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS TO PROVIDE:

8 (1) ADDITIONAL POSITIONS FOR PROVIDERS;

9 (2) PAID INTERNSHIPS FOR STUDENTS SEEKING TO BECOME 10 PROVIDERS;

11(3) STIPENDS FOR PROVIDERS THAT ARE DESIGNED TO ADDRESS12PROBLEMS IN PROVIDER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION; AND

13(4) STIPENDS FOR PROVIDERS WORKING IN LOW-PERFORMING14SCHOOLS THAT ARE DESIGNED TO ADDRESS PROBLEMS IN PROVIDER RECRUITMENT15AND RETENTION.

16 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 17 SECTION.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2024.
