"EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY" INCLUDES INTERSCHOLASTIC

ATHLETICS, MUSIC, DRAMA PROGRAMS, STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS, AND OTHER

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- 1 PROGRAMS SPONSORED BY A SCHOOL:
- 2 (I) IN WHICH A STUDENT MAY PARTICIPATE OUTSIDE REGULAR
- 3 SCHOOL HOURS; AND
- 4 (II) FOR WHICH A STUDENT DOES NOT EARN ACADEMIC CREDIT.
- 5 (3) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 6 FOR HOMESCHOOLED STUDENTS PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN CALVERT COUNTY.
- 8 (C) (1) THERE IS AN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES FOR 9 HOMESCHOOLED STUDENTS PILOT PROGRAM.

- 9 NOTICE, STAFF RESOURCES, TECHNOLOGY, PHYSICAL SPACE, AND LEGAL

The Workgroup shall:

- 1 (1) study the following issues regarding homeschooled student 2 participation in extracurricular activities sponsored by public schools in the county:
- 3 (i) administrative requirements, including public notice, staff 4 resources, technology, physical space, and legal liabilities;
- 5 (ii) costs of providing services not covered by State and local funding;
- 6 (iii) student program eligibility requirements, including academic, 7 health, and behavioral mandates across all types of extracurricular activities offered;
- 8 (iv) identifying and providing educational accommodations for 9 nonenrolled students;
- 10 (v) transportation of nonenrolled students, including costs, 11 mandates, and legal liability; and
- 12 (vi) student program enrollment limits;

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- 13 (2) study and evaluate data from other states or jurisdictions, if any, that 14 allow homeschooled students or other nonenrolled students to participate in 15 extracurricular activities sponsored by a public school; and
- 16 (3) make recommendations as to the administrative, financial, and logistical feasibility of homeschooled student participation in extracurricular activities sponsored by public schools in Calvert County.
  - (g) On or before December 31, 2024, the Workgroup shall report its findings and recommendations to the Board of Calvert County Commissioners, the Calvert County Board of Education, and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the members of the Calvert County Delegation to the General Assembly.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of June 30, 2030, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
