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Environmental Justice – Identification of and Investment in Overburdened and Underserved Communities – Report

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment to submit an annual report to the Governor and General Assembly beginning on or before a certain date relating to the identification of certain communities, the percentage of spending for certain investments that benefited certain communities during the prior fiscal year within certain governmental entities, and certain recommendations on improving the identification of and provision of assistance to certain communities; and generally relating to overburdened and underserved communities.
