- "Discriminatory boycott" means the entering into or carrying out of any 2 3 provision, express or implied, of any agreement, understanding or contractual arrangement 4 for economic benefit between any person and any foreign government, foreign person, or international organization, which is not specifically authorized by the law of the United 5 6 States and which is required or imposed, either directly or indirectly, overtly or covertly, 7 by the foreign government, foreign person, or international organization in order to restrict, 8 condition, prohibit, or interfere with any business relationship on the basis of a domestic 9 individual's race, color, creed, religion, sex, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, DISABILITY, GENDER IDENTITY, or national origin. Except, that entering into an agreement, understanding or 10 11 contractual arrangement with respect to the handling or shipping of goods while in 12 international and not intrastate transit or executing and delivering any other document 13 with respect to the handling or shipping of goods while in international and not intrastate 14 transit or carrying out or complying with any provision with respect to the choice of carrier 15 in international and not intrastate transit or the international routing of goods while in 16 international and not intrastate transit contained in any such agreement, understanding, 17 contractual arrangement or other document may not constitute a discriminatory boycott within the meaning of this subtitle. 18



It is the intent of the State to avoid becoming a passive participant in private sector commercial discrimination by refusing to procure goods and services from business entities that discriminate in the solicitation, selection, hiring, or commercial treatment of vendors, suppliers, subcontractors, or commercial customers on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin, sex, age, marital status, **GENDER IDENTITY**, sexual orientation, or on the basis of disability or other unlawful forms of discrimination by providing a procedure for receiving, investigating, and resolving complaints of discrimination filed against business entities that:

- 11 (2) have been selected to engage in, or are engaged in, providing goods or 12 services to the State.

Every contract and subcontract shall contain a nondiscrimination clause that reads as follows:

"As a condition of entering into this agreement, the company represents and warrants that it will comply with the State's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy, as described under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. As part of such compliance, the company may not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, **GENDER IDENTITY**, or on the basis of disability or other unlawful forms of discrimination in the solicitation, selection, hiring, or commercial treatment of subcontractors, vendors, suppliers, or commercial customers, nor shall the company retaliate against any person for reporting instances of such discrimination. The company shall provide equal opportunity for subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers to participate in all of its public sector and private sector subcontracting and supply opportunities, provided that nothing contained in this clause shall prohibit or limit otherwise lawful efforts to remedy the effects of marketplace discrimination that have occurred or are occurring in the marketplace. In preparing its bid on this project, the bidder has considered all proposals submitted from qualified, potential subcontractors and suppliers, and has not engaged in "discrimination" as defined in § 19–103 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland; to wit: discrimination in the solicitation, selection, or commercial treatment of any subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or commercial customer on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, GENDER IDENTITY, or on the basis of disability or other unlawful forms of discrimination. Without limiting the foregoing, "discrimination" also includes retaliating against any person or other entity for reporting any incident of "discrimination". Without limiting any other provision of the solicitation for bids on this project, it is understood and agreed that, if this certification is false, such false certification will constitute grounds for the State to reject the bid submitted by the bidder on this project, and terminate any contract awarded based on the bid. As part of its bid or proposal, the bidder shall provide to the State a list of all instances within the immediate past 4 years where there has been a final adjudicated determination in a legal or administrative proceeding in the State of Maryland that the bidder discriminated against its subcontractors, vendors, suppliers, or commercial customers, and a description of the status or resolution of that complaint, including any remedial action taken. As a condition of submitting a bid or proposal to the State, the bidder agrees to comply with the State's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy as described under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.".
