1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Economic Development – West North Avenue Development Authority –**  
3 **Alterations**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the administration and membership of the West North Avenue  
5 Development Authority; specifying the powers and duties of the Authority, subject  
6 to certain limitations; exempting the Authority from certain provisions of law;  
7 requiring the Authority to take certain actions regarding the finances of the  
8 Authority; exempting the Authority from certain taxation or assessments under  
9 certain circumstances; establishing the West North Avenue Development Authority  
10 Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; and generally relating to the West North Avenue  
11 Development Authority.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
2 That Section(s) 12-703.1 of Article – Economic Development of the Annotated Code of  
3 Maryland be repealed.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 12-702, 12-703,

13 (B) **“AUTHORITY” MEANS THE WEST NORTH AVENUE DEVELOPMENT**  
14 **AUTHORITY.**

15 (C) **“BOARD” MEANS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE AUTHORITY.**

16 [(b)] (D) “Buffer zone” means the area within 250 yards of the target area.

17 [(c)] (E) “Target area” means the portion of West North Avenue in Baltimore  
18 City between the 600 block and the 3200 block, inclusive.

19 (F) **“WEST NORTH AVENUE CORRIDOR” INCLUDES THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA**  
20 **CONSISTING OF THE TARGET AREA AND THE BUFFER ZONE.**

25 (A) There is a West North Avenue Development Authority in Baltimore City.

26 (B) **THE AUTHORITY IS A BODY POLITIC AND CORPORATE AND IS AN**  
27 **INSTRUMENTALITY OF THE STATE.**

28 (C) **THE EXERCISE BY THE AUTHORITY OF A POWER UNDER THIS SUBTITLE**  
29 **IS THE PERFORMANCE OF AN ESSENTIAL GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTION.**

2 (A) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS THAT:

3 (1) THERE EXISTS WITHIN VARIOUS NEIGHBORHOODS IN BALTIMORE  
4 CITY, PARTICULARLY THE WEST NORTH AVENUE CORRIDOR, A NEED FOR  
5 RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT OR REDEVELOPMENT IN  
6 FURTHERANCE OF THE PUBLIC'S INTEREST;

7 (2) THE WEST NORTH AVENUE CORRIDOR HAS EXPERIENCED LOW  
8 HOUSING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN THE COMMUNITY FOR DECADES;

9 (3) AREAS IN THE WEST NORTH AVENUE CORRIDOR INCLUDE BOTH  
10 AREAS THAT ARE CONSIDERED SLUM OR BLIGHTED AND AREAS THAT ARE  
11 DETERIORATED OR SUBJECT TO FURTHER DETERIORATING CONDITION, AND THOSE  
12 AREAS ARE IN NEED OF DEVELOPMENT OR REDEVELOPMENT FOR THE PUBLIC  
13 BENEFIT;

14 (4) THE REVITALIZATION OF AREAS WITHIN THE WEST NORTH  
15 AVENUE CORRIDOR NEEDING COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT OR REDEVELOPMENT IS  
16 AN ESSENTIAL GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTION AND IS A PUBLIC USE THAT WILL CONFER  
17 A PUBLIC BENEFIT ON CITIZENS OF BALTIMORE CITY BY:

18 (I) RELIEVING CONDITIONS OF UNEMPLOYMENT;

19 (II) ENCOURAGING THE INCREASE OF COMMERCE AND A  
20 BALANCED ECONOMY;

21 (III) ASSISTING IN THE RETENTION OF BUSINESSES AND  
22 RESIDENTS;

23 (IV) ATTRACTING NEW INDUSTRIES AND COMMERCE;

24 (V) PROMOTING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND GROWTH; AND

25 (VI) GENERALLY PROMOTING THE HEALTH, WELFARE, AND  
26 PUBLIC SAFETY OF RESIDENTS IN BALTIMORE CITY AND INCREASING PROPERTY  
27 TAX REVENUES FOR THE STATE AND THE CITY OF BALTIMORE;

28 (5) THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THIS PUBLIC AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE  
29 FINANCIAL RESOURCES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND ESTABLISHMENT OF  
30 RESIDENCES AND BUSINESSES THROUGH COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS IN THE  
31 TARGET AREA WILL SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE BALTIMORE CITY NEIGHBORHOODS

1 AND INCREASE PROPERTY TAX REVENUES FOR THE STATE AND THE CITY OF  
2 BALTIMORE; AND

3 (6) THE AUTHORITY IS THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY  
4 FOR THE STATE TO BENEFIT THE NEIGHBORHOODS OF BALTIMORE CITY WITHIN  
5 THE TARGET AREA.

6 (B) THE LEGISLATIVE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY ARE TO:

7 (1) REVIVE THE VARIOUS COMMUNITIES ALONG THE WEST NORTH  
8 AVENUE CORRIDOR IN BALTIMORE CITY;

9 (2) PROMOTE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT;

10 (3) ENCOURAGE THE INCREASE OF BUSINESS ACTIVITY, COMMERCE,  
11 AND A BALANCED ECONOMY IN BALTIMORE CITY;

12 (4) HELP TO RETAIN AND ATTRACT BUSINESS ACTIVITY AND  
13 COMMERCE IN BALTIMORE CITY; AND

14 (5) PROMOTE THE HEALTH, PUBLIC SAFETY, RIGHT OF GAINFUL  
15 EMPLOYMENT, AND WELFARE OF RESIDENTS OF BALTIMORE CITY.

16 (C) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY INTENDS THAT:

17 (1) THE AUTHORITY OPERATE AND EXERCISE ITS CORPORATE  
18 POWERS ALONG THE WEST NORTH AVENUE CORRIDOR IN BALTIMORE CITY;

19 (2) WITHOUT LIMITING ITS AUTHORITY TO OTHERWISE EXERCISE ITS  
20 POWERS, THE AUTHORITY EXERCISE ITS POWERS TO ASSIST PRIVATE REAL ESTATE  
21 ENTITIES AND NONPROFIT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATIONS TO  
22 DEVELOP AND REHABILITATE HOUSING AND COMMERCIAL UNITS IN BALTIMORE  
23 CITY AND SUPPORT LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGENCIES TO CONTRIBUTE  
24 TO THE EXPANSION, MODERNIZATION, AND RETENTION OF EXISTING ENTERPRISES  
25 IN BALTIMORE CITY AS WELL AS THE ATTRACTION OF NEW BUSINESSES TO  
26 BALTIMORE CITY; AND

27 (3) THE AUTHORITY SHOULD NOT OWN AND OPERATE A PROJECT  
28 UNLESS:

29 (I) THE BOARD DETERMINES BY RESOLUTION THAT THE  
30 PRIVATE SECTOR HAS NOT DEMONSTRATED SERIOUS AND SIGNIFICANT INTEREST  
31 AND DEVELOPMENT CAPACITY TO OWN AND OPERATE THE PROJECT; OR

1 (II) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT REQUESTS  
2 IN WRITING THAT THE AUTHORITY OWN AND OPERATE THE PROJECT.

26 (I) THE PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT; AND

27 (II) THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT.

1           **(B) THE AUTHORITY, ITS OFFICERS, AND ITS EMPLOYEES ARE SUBJECT TO**  
2 **THE PUBLIC ETHICS LAW.**

3           **(C) THE AUTHORITY, ITS OFFICERS, AND ITS EMPLOYEES ARE SUBJECT TO**  
4 **TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 4 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.**

6           **(a) A BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL MANAGE THE AUTHORITY AND**  
7 **EXERCISE ITS POWERS.**

8           **(B)** The [Authority] **BOARD** consists of the following members:

9           (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland who represents the target area,  
10 appointed by the President of the Senate;

11           (2) one member of the House of Delegates who represents the target area,  
12 appointed by the Speaker of the House;

13           (3) the Secretary of Housing and Community Development, or the  
14 Secretary's designee;

15           (4) the Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary's designee;

16           (5) the Secretary of Commerce, or the Secretary's designee;

17           (6) the Executive Director of the Maryland Economic Development  
18 Corporation, or the Executive Director's designee;

19           (7) one member of the Baltimore City Council who represents the target  
20 area, appointed by the President of the Baltimore City Council;

21           (8) one member appointed by the Mayor of Baltimore City;

22           (9) one member appointed by the Governor;

23           (10) the Director of the Baltimore Development Corporation, or the  
24 Director's designee;

25           (11) the Commissioner of the Baltimore City Department of Housing and  
26 Community Development, or the Commissioner's designee;

27           (12) the Director of the Baltimore City Department of Transportation, or the  
28 Director's designee;

1 (13) the Director of the Baltimore City Department of Planning, or the  
2 Director's designee;

3 (14) the President of Coppin State University, or the President's designee;

4 (15) the President of the Maryland Institute College of Art, or the  
5 President's designee;

6 (16) two members appointed by the chair of the Authority, or the chair's  
7 designee; and

8 (17) two members who are residents of communities impacted by the target  
9 area or buffer zone, **WITH ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING THE NEIGHBORHOODS EAST**  
10 **OF NORTH FULTON AVENUE AND ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING THE**  
11 **NEIGHBORHOODS WEST OF NORTH FULTON AVENUE**, selected by the majority vote of  
12 the leadership of the following organizations:

13 (i) Alliance of Rosemont Community Associations;

14 (ii) Bolton Hill Community Association;

15 (iii) Coppin Heights Community Development Corporation;

16 (iv) Druid Heights Community Development Corporation;

17 (v) Greater Mondawmin Coordinating Council;

18 (vi) Penn North Community Association; and

19 (vii) collectively, the leadership of the Reservoir Hill Improvement  
20 Council, the Reservoir Hill Association, and the Upper Eutaw Madison Neighborhood  
21 Association.
