images of minors.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 18 INDICATED.

19(2) "DISSEMINATE" MEANS TO PUBLISH, POST, OR OTHERWISE20DISCLOSE INFORMATION ON A PUBLIC INTERNET SITE OR ON A PUBLIC FORUM.

21 (3) "PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION" MEANS NAME, 22 ADDRESS, TELEPHONE NUMBER, DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER, SOCIAL SECURITY



NUMBER, PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT, EMPLOYEE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER, HEALTH
 INSURANCE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER, MEDICAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER,
 MOTHER'S MAIDEN NAME, BANK OR OTHER FINANCIAL INSTITUTION ACCOUNT
 NUMBER, DATE OF BIRTH, PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER, UNIQUE
 BIOMETRIC DATA, INCLUDING FINGERPRINT, VOICE PRINT, RETINA OR IRIS IMAGE,
 OR OTHER UNIQUE PHYSICAL REPRESENTATION, DIGITAL SIGNATURE, CREDIT
 CARD NUMBER OR OTHER PAYMENT DEVICE NUMBER, OR SCHOOL ADDRESS.

8 **(B) A** PERSON MAY NOT INTENTIONALLY DISSEMINATE THE PERSONAL 9 IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OR IMAGES OF A MINOR:

- 10 (1) WITHOUT EXPRESS PERMISSION; AND
- 11 (2) WITH THE INTENT TO INTIMIDATE OR HARM THE MINOR.

12 (C) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED OR APPLIED IN A MANNER THAT 13 VIOLATES A PERSON'S RIGHTS TO FREEDOM OF SPEECH UNDER THE U.S. 14 CONSTITUTION OR THE MARYLAND DECLARATION OF RIGHTS.

15 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR 16 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR A 17 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2024.
